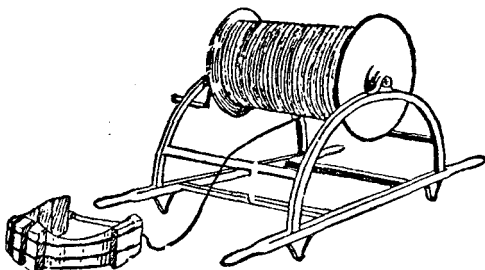

# Twelfth Annual Report and Financial Statement

To be presented at the Annual General Meeting to be held at 7.30 p.m.  
SATURDAY, OCTOBER 21st, 1944.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

In recording the activities of the Association during the past year appreciation is expressed by the Council to the continuance of the spirit of loyalty and co-operation as between District Associations, Individual Clubs, and the Officers of the Association, which has existed since the formation of the Association in 1932.

The Council here expresses its appreciation of the work of District Associations and Individual Clubs during another year clouded by the activities of War.

The past year, despite so many difficulties, can, without hesitation, be recorded as a year of definite progress and of excellent achievements in all directions.

As in previous reports, it will be necessary to condense the varied activities, but due regard will be given to their importance to the well-being and conduct of the Association.

The continuance of the World War has helped, during the year under review, to still further reduce the senior strength of our Clubs, but this loss, in many cases, has been offset by the enrolment of Lady and Junior members.

During the year a new Club on the West Coast of the South Island at Runanga was formed, and indications point to a very live Club operating there during the coming season.

In this report will be recorded the Association's contribution to the Fighting Forces of the Allied Nations, and discloses a record of achievement worthy of any national organisation in the Dominion. Our members are operating in all sections of war activities and in all parts of the world. Great has been their work in the cause of Democracy, and in this report the Association pays its humble but sincere tribute to them.

The Roll of Honour discloses the great loss the Association has sustained, and will remain as a monument to the loyalty and devotion to duty of our members.

During the year the National Ladies' and Junior Surf Life-Saving Championships were held, and were a pronounced success and justified the decision of the previous annual general meeting that EVERY EFFORT WOULD BE MADE TO CARRY ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE ASSOCIATION TO THE FULLEST EXTENT DESPITE WAR CONDITIONS PREVAILING.

Many new young members have been enrolled in the clubs, and appreciation is here expressed to the Principals of Secondary Schools and Colleges who have assisted the Association in its efforts to fill its ranks, so heavily depleted through war conditions, by the infusion of young and enthusiastic boys and girls from their institutions.

The Ladies' Clubs and Ladies' Section of Clubs are doing a great work, and the patrolling of our many beaches is in their capable hands,

and with the remaining senior members and junior members the public are assured that where at all possible every effort is made to ensure the presence of Beach Patrols at week-ends and holiday periods.

### HIS MAJESTY KING GEORGE VI.

The passing of years in no way lessens the keen and personal interest of Their Majesties the King and Queen in the work of the R.L.S.S. and our Association. We record with pleasure the fact that Her Royal Highness Princess Elizabeth is now Vice-Patron of the Society. We pray that Their Majesties will long be spared to reign over the Commonwealth of Nations.

### ACTIVE SERVICE, AT HOME AND OVERSEAS.

The Council again places on record, on behalf of the Association, its appreciation of the fact that in all phases of war activity, whether on land, sea, or in the air, members of our clubs are operating in many parts of the world. They are rendering great service, necessitating, as it does, many sacrifices. We regret that this past year has added many more names to our list of DEPARTED MEMBERS, and many others have been laid aside under conflict.

In conveying our sympathies to the relatives of our fallen members we pay humble tribute to their memory. To the wounded and the sick we pray for a speedy recovery, and to those who are confined to camps under enemy nations we pray that very soon conditions will prevail allowing them a speedy return to their homes and kinfolk.

### PATROL DUTIES.

As referred to in the last annual report, the activities of several clubs to operate on their own beaches again restricted to a certain degree the opportunity of increased beach patrolling. It is pleasing to record that gradually this restriction, forced by military necessity, is being removed, and it is hoped that ere the next season dawns all our clubs will have free use of the beaches under their control. Despite these restrictions, the hours of beach patrolling in the interest of the bathing public has maintained a high figure. The Council extends its appreciation to the clubs and members for the work that they have done during the past season, and here it was found that the ladies and junior teams have worthily upheld the work of the Association carried out in pre-war years mainly by the senior members.

Hours of Patrol ..... 39,328

With an increase of 961 hours over the previous year's figures indications point to the desire of clubs to secure for bathers as efficient protection it is possible to give under existing war conditions. When all clubs are again at full numerical strength it may be possible to still widen the areas of beaches throughout the Dominion where Surf Life-Saving Patrols will be operating.

### SURF LIFE-SAVING MEDALLIONS.

The test of all-round efficiency in Surf Life-Saving work is the candidate's ability to pass the surf medallion test, and every effort is made by the controlling authorities and by the local examiners to see that no diminution of the standard required of candidates is permitted. The Association has no desire to pass candidates merely for the purpose of creating large figures in its reports, and accepts as its maxim, those who are passed must be all-round efficient. The life of the bather in

distress is the important thing to safeguard. To safeguard efficiently one must be efficiently trained. Congratulations are here extended to the successful candidates during the past season; to the unsuccessful ones we would urge continuance of study and practice until recognised efficiency is attained.

The above figures are from 33 clubs. The Council regrets that, due to present conditions and the desire to conserve paper, it is not possible to individualise the clubs and their rescues in this report.

### ANNUAL APPEAL TO GENERAL PUBLIC.

The Council, on behalf of the Association, desires to record its sincere appreciation of the efforts of the bathing public during last summer in an earnest endeavour to co-operate with the Surf Life-Saving Clubs throughout the Dominion by concentrating as much as possible their bathing within restricted areas under the control of club patrols. This effort has helped considerably to ensure a more constant watch on all bathers, especially non- or weak swimmers. The Association again solicits the co-operation of the public in this matter, and feels assured that in the passing of time and the recognition of the sound logic and value of this appeal, that ere long it will become a natural habit to bathe near and as close to surf life-saving club buildings as possible. The individual who may think that he or she may look better swimming alone, may ultimately find that they will be very much alone.

### CO-OPERATION OF GOVERNMENT RADIO SERVICES.

It is befitting in this portion of the Annual Report to place on record the Association's sincere appreciation of the support given to the general public appeal re bathing by the Hon. W. E. Parry, M.P. (Minister of Internal Affairs), Hon. D. Wilson (Minister of Broadcasting), Professor J. Shelley (Director of Broadcasting), and the National and Commercial Broadcasting Services of the Dominion. Undoubtedly this valuable assistance to our appeal has been a deciding factor in the success attained last summer. The VOICE OF THE RADIO will play an ever-increasing part in the campaign to save lives on our foreshores, rivers and lakes, and we appreciate the assistance given to our organisation by this powerful medium of sound education.

## CO-OPERATION—SALES TAX—MANUFACTURE OF SURF MEDALLIONS—TEA AND SUGAR RATIONS FOR PATROLS.

The Council desires to record its appreciation of the co-operation of the Customs Department in waiving the Sales Tax payable on Surf Life-Saving Medallions.

To the Rationing Food Controller for granting rationing of tea and sugar for surf patrols whilst on duty.

To the Metal Controller for granting permit to manufacture surf medallions, thus permitting distribution of 1942-43 and 1943-44 medallions. The permit granted allows a small overcarry for the incoming year.

The foregoing concessions to our activities are accepted as an indication of the desire of the Government to assist our organisation as much as possible.

## N.Z. SURF LIFE-SAVING LADIES AND JUNIOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The National Championships were conducted by the Wellington District Surf Association, on behalf of the Council, and were most successful. Sixteen Clubs were represented, and the efficiency displayed by teams and by individuals was of a general high standard. The National Championships were opened by His Excellency the Governor-General, Sir Cyril Newall (Patron) on January 15th. The March-Past of Teams on both days was impressive. The Council desires, in this condensed report of its activities, to record its appreciation of the excellent arrangements made by the controlling Association and its officers and to the officials who conducted so successfully the 1944 series of National Surf Championships. The following clubs competed:—Takapuna, Milford (Auckland), Waitara (Taranaki), Castlecliff Ladies, Castlecliff (Wanganui), Titahi Bay, Lyall Bay, Maranui, Island Bay, Wellington Ladies, South Brighton, New Brighton, North Beach (Canterbury), St. Kilda, St. Clair, and Balclutha (Otago).

During the series of National Championships, open events for senior members were conducted, also beach events on both days. Members of the National Board of Judges and the Carnival officials are congratulated on the success of the 1944 series of National Surf Championships.

### 1945 National Ladies' and Junior Surf Life-Saving Championships.

These have been allotted to the Otago District Surf Association to conduct on behalf of the Council, and it is hoped that it may be possible to institute a series of Senior War-time Championships, for the Council recognises that with the increasing number of our senior members returning from active military service that efforts should be made to include national events for which they can compete.

### ANNUAL RETURNS.

Thirty-three clubs have furnished their annual return forms. This can be considered satisfactory under existing circumstances, but the Council desires to indicate the necessity of the prompt forwarding of the Clubs' Annual Return Forms for recording purposes.

### FORMATION OF NEW CLUB.

The Council records with pleasure the formation of the Runanga-Rapahoe Club (Westland). This Club, consisting mainly of miners, has already established itself, and the teams are steadily training, and the Club is building a new club-house and securing the most up-to-date equipment. The Council here records its appreciation of helpful assistance

given to our new Club by the officers and members of the Greymouth Club. We wish the new Club every success, and feel sure that the community of the district will readily assist the new institution in its midst.

### **SURF LIFE-SAVING IN THE PACIFIC ISLANDS.**

It is the pleasure of your Council to report on the activities of members of surf life-saving clubs on active service in the Pacific Islands, and if space would permit, such a recording would be lengthy. Due to the keen interest of the Department of Defence and the Military Authorities in the Pacific, ably supported by the New Zealand Patriotic Board, opportunity was given to the members of surf life-saving clubs to undertake surf life-saving work in various localities, and the soundness of this decision is justified by the number of rescues from drowning secured by our members. Drill and patrol work was undertaken, and the knowledge gained by members in their clubs in the Dominion was widely distributed amongst the troops overseas and the people of the various Islands. When opportunity offered, inter-unit competitions were held, and reports indicate a high standard of efficiency. Thanks are extended to our members overseas who have assisted in the efforts made to widen the scope of the surf life-saving movement in the Pacific Islands, and to Sergeant E. B. Hughes (Maranui) and to the members of clubs who have undertaken this work under trying conditions we extend appreciation of their services.

### **NEW ZEALAND SURF LIFE-SAVING ASSOCIATION. ANNUAL REPORT ON LONDON TROPHY COMPETITION, 18th SEPTEMBER, 1944.**

In submitting my report for the eighth year of competition, I desire to state that despite the many difficulties facing us after five years of war, we can record very satisfactory results in this competition.

This season no less than 122 Surf Medallions were gained, an increase of over 100 per cent. on the previous two years, and our highest number since 1940. Also the record number of 14 Surf Instructors' Certificates were awarded, and this augurs well for the future, as with extra strength in capable instructors an increasing number of candidates for the various awards can be trained.

These increases in the aforementioned awards were, in my opinion, greatly assisted by the fact that for the first time since 1940 we conducted National Championships for Ladies and Juniors, thus stimulating interest in the various districts, who were all represented by teams at Wellington in January last.

As the attached detailed summary shows, the competition was again won by Otago, followed by Wellington, Canterbury, Auckland, and Taranaki. All districts are to be congratulated on their splendid efforts, despite that some Surf Club buildings are not yet available and several Clubs are still not operating, as very few senior members have as yet returned from overseas.

In conclusion, I want to assure our Clubs and their members how proud we are of their work, these young ladies and men who voluntarily perform a noble service that has become a necessity in our community. Our thanks are again due to the R.L.S.S., England, the donors of the trophy, which has encouraged and stimulated the work of our Associations, who aim to make the surf beaches throughout this Dominion safe for old and young citizens of our country to enjoy.

## LADIES' TEAMS—JUNIOR MEMBERS.

The Council again records its appreciation of the work of the Ladies' Teams and Junior Members, and the increasing number in these two sections indicate the growing popularity of surf life-saving activities as a medium of physical and educational development. The N.Z.S.L.S.A. has been able, during these long years of war, to continue its Dominion-wide activity, mainly through the assistance given and the enthusiasm of the Ladies and Juniors.

## NEW ZEALAND COUNCIL OF SPORT.

The Association has become one of the affiliated national organisations to the recently constituted N.Z. Council of Sport, and visualises the possible benefits to be derived by such an organisation for the well-being of all sporting and kindred organisations. Guided on a wide national basis, and avoiding any sectional leaning, the prospects of attaining worth-while results must be apparent to all. The formation of this new national body has long been the ideal and objective of the Hon. Minister of Internal Affairs (Hon. W. E. Parry, M.P.), who has for many years voiced the value of full co-operative effort in physical development.

## NEW ZEALAND GOVERNMENT AND THE ASSOCIATION.

Your Council makes no apology for reiterating its deep appreciation of the continued practical interest shown by the Government in the activities of the Association, for without its financial assistance it would have been impossible to have reached the high standard of efficiency and the widening of the activities of the Association.

To the Hon. Minister of Internal Affairs (Hon. W. E. Parry, M.P.) thanks are again extended for his personal interest in the operations of the Association, and to the Officers of the Department for the courtesy extended to our officials.

## FINANCES.

The financial position, as disclosed in this report, indicates a sound position at the end of the financial year. The credit balance is maintained to meet two large disbursements during the coming year—purchase from England of 32 surf lines and the cost of producing the new Handbook. The credit carried forward will in no way meet the forthcoming liabilities, and this matter will be considered at the Annual General Meeting. Mr. F. H. Jackson again kindly consented to record the financial position of the Association, and thanks are extended to him.

## NEW OFFICIAL HANDBOOK.

Your Council, in setting up a special Committee to consider the question of the printing of a new Handbook of the Association, was fully aware of the possible large increase in expenditure required under present conditions. The important point to consider was whether it could be expected that young members could be taught the necessary drill, etc., with the present unsatisfactory books of instruction, constituting three separate books. Realising that it was necessary that new Handbooks should be secured as possible, the special sub-committee—Messrs. F. Chapman (Convener), F. H. Jackson, R. Perkins, J. O. Haworth, H. Dickson, D. T. Woodfield, and N. A. Ingram—have co-ordinated the three books now in use and, with suggestions received from District Associations and

National Board of Judges, have made considerable progress in the compilation. Several matters of importance requiring consideration of the Annual General Meeting will be placed before the representatives assembled. It is hoped that the new Official Educational Handbook will be ready for distribution during December.

#### **N.Z. LADIES 4-MAN ALARM CHAMPIONSHIPS.**

On the ground of possible physical strain to competitors serious consideration has been given during the year to a recommendation that this event be deleted from National Championships programmes. Opinions were secured from District Associations, Individual Clubs, National Board of Judges, and the Hon. Medical Advisers of the Association (Sir J. S. Elliott and Dr. H. T. Pettit). Though the majority of opinion desired the continuance of the event, the matter has been referred to the Annual General Meeting for consideration, as well as a further recommendation that this event be retained, but that the N.Z. Ladies' Individual Surf Race Championship be deleted on the score of possible physical strain much greater than possible in the 4-man event.

#### **N.Z.A.A.S.A. AND N.Z. COUNCIL, R.L.S.S.**

Your Council records its appreciation of the continuance of the spirit of goodwill and co-operation as between the three national bodies during the past year.

#### **NATIONAL COMMITTEE OF SWIMMING AND LIFE-SAVING.**

The report of the Committee will be placed before the Annual General Meeting by your delegates (Messrs. V. L. Allan and W. H. Gerrie). The report indicates a successful year of effort on behalf of the natatorial organisations of the Dominion.

#### **APPRECIATION OF SERVICES OF DELEGATES.**

The Council desires to extend its thanks and appreciation of the services of Messrs. D. Lucas, C. Adams, L. Dawkins (A.S.L.S.A.), H. S. Feast (New Zealand A.S.A.), G. D. Griffiths (N.Z. Council, R.L.S.S.), V. L. Allan and W. H. Gerrie (National Committee of Swimming and Life-Saving) during the past year.

To the Government of the Dominion for its continued practical interest.

To the Hon. W. E. Parry, M.P., for his personal interest in our activities.

## CONCLUSION.

Despite the activities of War the past year's activities of the Association indicate progress in all sections. With the ever-growing possibility of an early termination of hostilities and the increasing number of our members returning from Active Service, the prospects for the coming season appear bright. Without the continued assistance of so many of our older members during the past few years in administrative and carnival activities, the past year could never have reached the degree of success attained, and the thanks of the Association are herein extended to these members.

"THE NATIONAL ROLLS OF SERVICES AND THE NATIONAL ROLL OF HONOUR INCLUDED IN THIS ANNUAL REPORT MAY NOT, FOR VARIED REASONS, BE NEAR COMPLETE, AND SHOULD YOUR NAME NOT APPEAR IN SAME, WE HERE EXPRESS OUR REGRETS. THE OMISSION IN NO WAY LESSENS OUR APPRECIATION OF THE SACRIFICES YOU ALL ARE MAKING FOR THE FUTURE PEACE AND HAPPINESS OF THE PEOPLE OF THE NATIONS."
