



## BP Surf Rescue South Island Championships Entry Memo

This year sees the BP Surf Rescue South Island Championships heads to the beautiful beach of Warrington. In this entry memo you will find a large amount of information that will assist you with your entries into the first major IRB based sports event of the season, and it is sure to be a great weekend of fast and exhilarating racing from some of the best IRB racers in the country.

### Event Entry Process

This season we will be using a new online entry system called EnterNow for the BP Surf Rescue South Island IRB Championships. All entry fees will be calculated via the online entry system following the close of entries and your club will be invoiced directly.



## Team Declaration Forms

This year with the new EnterNow entry system there is no need to complete Team Declaration Forms as well as entries. Just complete the Entries on line as per the entry process.

## Eligibility of competitors

This competition is open to any SLSNZ affiliated club. Without the following details your members will not be eligible to compete nor will they be able to be entered through the online entry system. SLSNZ reserve the right to limit the number of competitors per event.

- a) Current Members (i.e. must not be stored in the 'Last Season Members' or 'Historical Members' folder on the PAM Database.
- b) Have a DOB recorded on the PAM Database.
- c) Have a PRIMARY membership with the club they intend to compete for (membership status displayed in the 'Membership' tab of the individual in the Database)
- d) Team substitutes must be registered in some capacity in the event (see notes below)
- e) It is a requirement of the event that competitors hold the Surf Lifeguard Award and currently refreshed.
- f) Combined club teams for relays will not be permitted.
- g) All IRB Drivers must hold a current/refreshed Senior Lifeguard IRB Drivers qualification.
- h) All IRB Crewperson must hold a Crewperson Award qualification.

## Age

A competitor's age group is determined by their age as at midnight on 30th September 2015. For example if you were 21 by the 30th of September 2015, you are ineligible to compete in the Under 21 division. All competitors and patients must hold their SLGA to be eligible to compete at the 2016 BP Surf Rescue North Island Championships.

## Team Substitutes

As stated in (e) above, all team substitutes must be registered in some capacity in the competition. . In some instances clubs have to substitute members for their team events which can be problematic if the person who is the substitute is not competing in any other event. Therefore any potential substitutes (who are not already competing) must be entered into the Team Substitutes Event. This is to allow fairness to all by ensuring that all eligibility criteria are met.

**Please Note:** The event Substitution Event has a \$10 cost associated with it and will be billed out to clubs along with their team entries. Individual entries cannot be substituted for by another competitor; only team entries as outlined in the Surf Sport Competition Manual.

## Event Rules

The BP Surf Rescue South Island Championships will be conducted under the rules contained in the following documents:

## Event times and proposed programme

The following is a general indication of the competition programme and should only be used as a guide at this stage. A detailed daily timetable of events is being prepared and will be circulated once final entry numbers are received.

<b>Scrutineering:</b>	Friday 11 <sup>th</sup> March, 1.00pm to 7.00pm, St Kilda SLSC, Dunedin
<b>Team Managers Meeting:</b>	Friday 11 <sup>th</sup> March, 7.00pm, St Kilda SLSC, Dunedin
<b>Fuel Distribution:</b>	Saturday 12 <sup>th</sup> March, 7.00am to 8.00am
<b>Officials Meeting:</b>	Saturday 12 <sup>th</sup> 7.30am at Warrington Beach
<b>Racing Starts:</b>	Saturday 12 <sup>th</sup> March, 9.00am, Warrington Beach
<b>Prize Giving:</b>	There will be a prize giving and dinner after the event, in a more traditional format.

## Event Equipment

All clubs are required to supply their own competition equipment which must comply with the SLSNZ equipment specifications as specified within the SLSNZ Equipment Specifications Manual. ## IRB Racing Policy Changes

The following rules are draft changes to the Sport Policy SPS010 due to safety concerns raised prior to the BP Surf Rescue North Island Championships and as communicated prior to that event, These changes are still under review by the NSC and changes may still be made.

- With the one exception below, lifejackets are compulsory for all IRB Drivers, Crew and Patients in competition and competition training from the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016. Prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016, the wearing of lifejackets is highly recommended.
  - Note for the Tube Rescue Race patients do not need to wear a lifejacket but will be required to wear a High Visibility Vest and continue to be clipped in the rescue tube while in the boat.
- With the one exception below, helmets are compulsory for all IRB Patients in competition and competition training from the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016. Prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016, the wearing of helmets is highly recommended for patients.
  - Note for the Tube Rescue Race patients do not need to wear a helmet
- The wearing of a high visibility colour on a competitors lifejacket or addition vest overtop is optional for drivers, crewperson and patients while wearing a lifejacket. Patients are still required to wear a high visibility vest for the tube rescue event if they choose not to wear a lifejacket



## Fuel Ordering and Fuel Station

This year for IRB Events Clubs are required to pre order their fuel amount prior to the competition which will be on-charged to the club following the event. SLSNZ will purchase all the fuel as per the orders and each club will be issues with the amount they ordered all in one go for the duration of the event. The fuel station will be open on Saturday before racing starts. Crews will need to bring their own fuel containers that can take the full amount of fuel the club has ordered for racing. SLSNZ will have a fuel disposal drum available at the fuel station; please respect the environment and dispose of all or any unwanted fuel responsibly. The Fuel Order form can be found via this link. ## Scrutineering

Dave Hickey will be in touch with clubs following the close of entries to organise scrutineering venues and times. ## Medal Presentations

At the conclusion of racing on Saturday we will be presenting medals to all place getters in each event that were contestable during the event. You are encouraged to stay behind and recognize those who have achieved during these Championships.

A reminder, please ensure that all recipients must be suitably attired with club beanies and club uniforms. Club Points and Presentations Club points will be allocated for all finals as follows:

**Team Events:** 1<sup>st</sup> place – 5 points; 2<sup>nd</sup> place – 3 points; 3<sup>rd</sup> place – 1 point

## Team Managers Details

Please ensure that you take the time to enter your Team Manager's contact details at the time of entries to ensure we can communication with your club about the event. This will provide timely information to key personnel and confirm that all Team Managers know what decisions have been made at all times. To assist in this process.
