New Zealand Representative Challenge

Entry Memo

INTRODUCTION:

The 2018 New Zealand Representative Challenge is an extremely competitive representative competition, including a comprehensive competition programme hosted over one day of high intensity racing. An overall point score will be maintained throughout the competition, with the winner being declared the 2018 New Zealand Representative Challenge Champions.

The event will be conducted on Monday 29 January, following the conclusion of the Eastern Region Senior Championships, held between Friday 26 January and Sunday 28 January. The New Zealand Representative Challenge concluding four days of competitive racing.

REPRESENTATIVE AREAS:

The following areas are invited to attend the 2016 NZ Representative Challenge.

- Otago, Canterbury, Wellington, Taranaki, Hawkes Bay, Gisborne, Bay of Plenty, Northern

Each area are invited to enter an Open Team and Youth Team (U19). The team makeup will be as per below and each area will have a minimum of one Coach and Manager per area. If area's wish to have separate coaches, managers and/or support people for Youth and Open then it is at their discretion.

Note that it was decided not to include a U20 female IRB crew for the Youth Team due to an assessment of the current female's crews racing and their ages would mean to many areas would not be able to field full teams.

We are hopeful with the inclusion of the U20 female grade for general racing IRB crew numbers in this division will increase and we will be able to include the U20 female crew's in future representative challenges.

Please note that for the male IRB events the patients also have to be male and for the female IRB events the patients have to be female.

Events will be run as per the SLSNZ [Surf Sports Competition Manual](#) with the addition of the separate male and female patients and the information stated in this Entry Memo.

SELECTION AND DRAFTING:

Athletes will be selected to represent their areas following an area selection process. Selection of athletes to compete at the New Zealand Representative Challenge will be left to the discretion of each area.

Should areas lack the ability to field a full team "drafting" from other areas will be permitted for both Open and Youth Teams.

The following guidelines to drafting should be used when negotiating between areas.

- It is recommended that if an area is requiring drafts that the Local Sports Committee reviews this and designs a development plan to show how the area will develop athletes to fill the required positions for future NZRC's.
- Athletes cannot compete for a Youth and Open team and must only be in one team due to the continuous racing programme over one day.
- It is the responsibility of the coach and/or manager to negotiate with other area's coaches and/or managers for required draft athletes. This is to enable clear communication between area teams so there is not miss communication for athletes. A full list of contacts will be shared once all coaches and managers have been appointed.
- Areas have first rights in selection to athletes who are primary members of clubs in their area. (e.g. Northern have first rights in selecting Mairangi Bay athletes)
- It is highly recommended to have all drafting discussions completed prior to the 1st January so athletes have time to prepare for the event and entries can be completed for both the ERC's and the NZRC.

POINTS SCORE:

All races will be awarded the following points which will be combined to the area total.

- 1st = 8 points
- 2nd = 7 points
- 3rd = 6 points
- 4th = 5 points
- 5th = 4 points
- 6th = 3 points
- 7th = 2 points
- 8th = 1 point
- DQ = 0 points
- DNF = 0 points

Any situation where a DQ or DNF is required will result in zero points for that race. Should a tie in points occur in an event then an average of the two position points will be awarded. (note that in Beach Flags if you are DQ for a false start then you retain the points for the position you finished in). In events that have two athletes racing separately in individual events (e.g. Board Race) their finishing positions will be added together to give an area total then points will be allocated as per above based on their combined score. Note that the lowest combined score receives first place (8pnts), second lowest received second (7pnts) etc..

Points and will be awarded separately for the Open and Youth age groups and medals for Youth and Open awarded to first, second and third placed Teams.

EVENT ENTRY PROCESS:

STEP ONE: Area expressions of interest

Areas are required to show an expression of interest to entering the New Zealand Representative Challenge followed by a team entry by the dates identified below. The Expression of Interest form can be found in Appendix One. Expressions of interest should be made from the Local Sport Committees of each area.

Expression of interest are due by Monday 20th November 2017. The Expression of Interest Form is to be emailed to scottybicknell@gmail.com by the due date.

STEP TWO: Payment of team entry

Payment is required to SLSNZ for the entire team's entry prior to the event entries being due. Full payment details will be sent to Team Managers to manage once Team Manager details have been updated for teams. Once SLSNZ has received full payment for their team then managers will be given access to make their team entries using EnterNow.

The entry fee is \$40 per athlete and must be paid prior to entry.

STEP THREE: Check that athletes meet the athlete eligibility criteria prior to entering events

Members selected into their area team must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Refreshed Surf Lifeguards for the current season OR newly qualified Surf Lifeguards in the current season.

- Current Members
- Have a DOB recorded on the SLSNZ Database.
- Have a PRIMARY membership with the area they intend to compete for. (note if they are part of the draft then they just require a primary membership of a club)

All competitors, including possible substitutes and drafts are to have met all of the eligibility criteria outlined above by the close of entries.

STEP FOUR: Enter athletes into events

Team Entries are due by 11:00am Monday 15th January 2018. Entries for each team will be completed on line using the EnterNow entry system. Login details for this system will be given to Team Managers once their full team has completed payment for the team entry.

Team entries should be made by the appointed Team Manager and/or Coach for the areas Open and/or Youth Team’s.

Should a team pull out of the event following the date of entry fees being due then policy SPS009 will apply. Note that if multiple teams pull out of the competition following their team entry and the event is cancelled due to lack of entries then those teams who didn’t pull out will receive a full refund of their entry fee.

Once you are logged into EnterNow select the event (Open or Youth) by clicking on the blue tab labelled “Entry Form”.

There are two section to entries; individual and team. Under “Competitor Events” you can add a competitor to individual events by typing in their name then using the boxes available selecting the events you wish to put them in. Under “Entries” you select the team event first via the drop box then select add entry and you enter the names of athletes to the event.

At any stage you can download a confirmation of entries. Draft athletes are to be sent to scottybicknell@gmail.com with the draft athlete full name and events you wish them to enter and SLSNZ will add these.

ATHLETE PLANNER:

An Athlete Planner Form can be found in Appendix Three for your planning prior to entering your teams. This is based on the draft event programme. This will be available on the website in Word format [here](#), so you can type directly onto the document.

However, the event management are currently exploring the possibility of utilising only one arena and the final programme will be released on the 21st of October 2017. All relevant documentation will be updated at that point.

COMPETITION EQUIPMENT AND SPECIFICATIONS:

Each team shall be responsible for the provision of their own equipment, and all equipment must comply with [SLSNZ Equipment Specifications Manual](#).

UNIFORMS:

SLSNZ will supply all representative teams with beanies for use during the event. All beanies will be required to be returned to SLSNZ at the completion of the event. High Visible vests are to be worn by all competitors in the water and comply with the [SLSNZ vest standards](#). Vests are the athlete's responsibility to supply unless SLSNZ received sponsorship for the event and the supply of vests. All other uniform is at the discretion of the areas and the management team.

PROGRAMME:

A draft event programme is provided as Appendix Two. However, the event management are currently exploring the possibility of utilising only one arena and the final programme will be released on the 21st of October 2017. All relevant documentation will be updated at that point.

ADDITIONAL RULES TO THE SURF SPORT COMPETITION MANUAL:

OCEANMAN/OCEANWOMAN RELAY

General Conditions

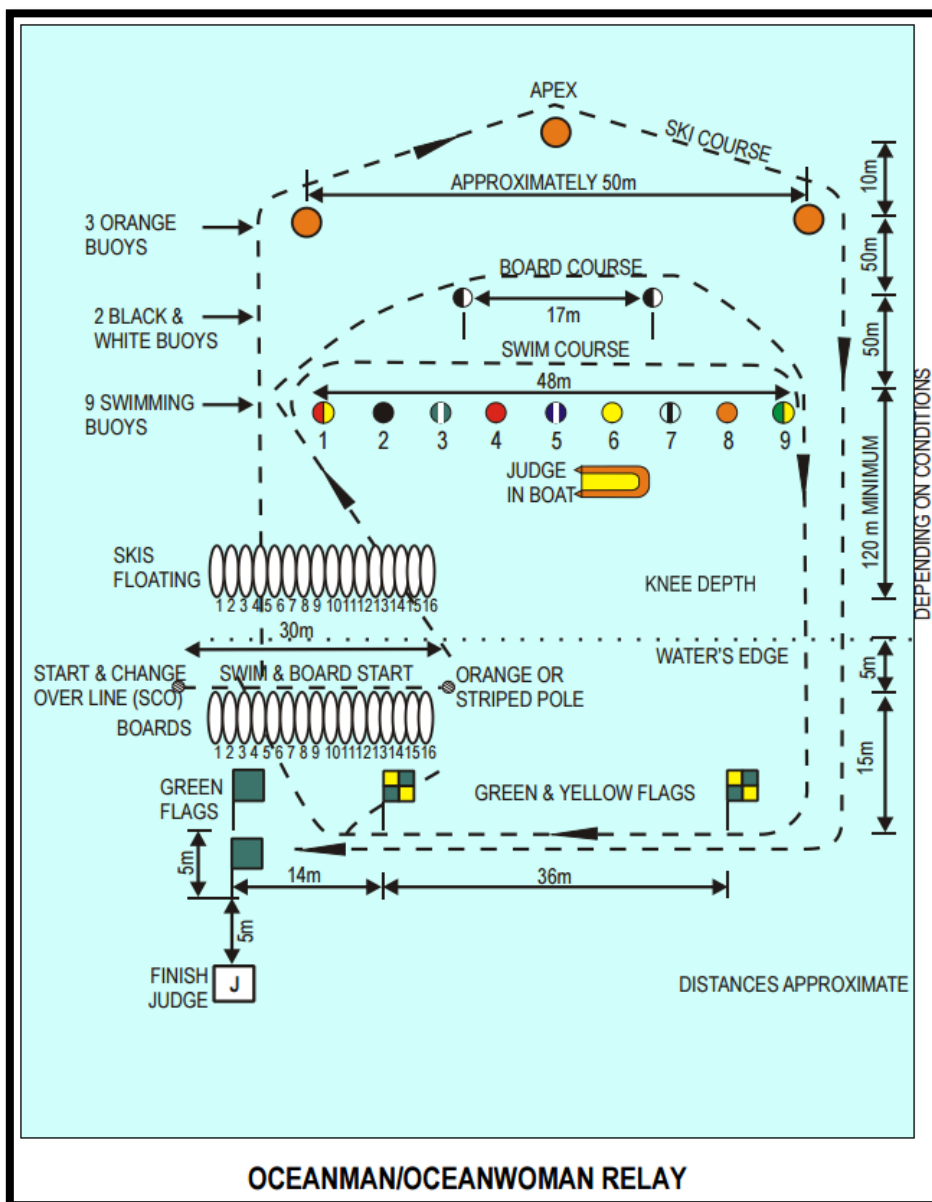
- (a) Teams of four competitors (one swimmer, one board paddler, one surf ski paddler, and one runner) cover the course in a sequence of legs determined by draw at the start of each competition. The run leg is always the final leg. If the surf ski leg is first, competitors shall start with a typical in-water start.
- (b) No member of a team shall be permitted to complete more than one leg of a Race.
- (c) Conditions of racing of each leg are as generally required for the individual conditions of that discipline including the rules governing the component disciplines: surf ski races, board races, surf races, beach sprints. To ensure fair starts and finishes, alignment of the start line and finish line to the buoys may be altered at the discretion of the Chief Referee, depending on the prevailing sea conditions. Competitors must commence their leg of the event from the correct allotted beach position.

Procedure

The following event description assumes the order to be: swim – board – surf ski – run. The course direction is clockwise.

- (a) Swim leg: From a beach start, swimmers enter the water, swim around the swimming course buoys, return to the beach, run around the two turning flags to tag the board paddlers who are waiting with their boards, feet on, or on the shoreward side of, the start/changeover line.
- (b) Board leg: Board paddlers enter the water with their boards; pass swim buoy 1 on the outside; round the two board course buoys; return to the beach passing swim buoy 9 on the outside; round the two turning flags, and through the start/changeover line to tag the surf ski paddlers, who are waiting with their surf skis and paddles in approximately knee depth water. On their return, board paddlers may leave their boards at the water's edge.
- (c) Surf ski leg: Surf ski paddlers paddle around the surf ski course buoys and return to shore to tag the runners waiting at the water's edge or in the water. Paddlers must pass on the outside of all buoys. Paddlers shall not cut through the swim course or board course buoys. The location of the tag is at the discretion of the team provided it occurs after the last swim course buoy and before the first turning flag.
- (d) Run leg: Runners then round one turning flag, pass the other flag on the shoreward side, and continue to the finish between the two finish flags. Team members shall place gear adjacent to the respective starting areas for the various craft.
- (e) Equipment removal: To assist with the safe conduct of the event, team members and/or handlers may remove damaged or abandoned equipment from the course during the race provided the progress of other competitors is not obstructed.
- (f) Contact with craft: Competitors must be in contact with the surf ski or board up to and including the last course buoy. Competitors shall not be disqualified if they lose contact with the craft on the return journey from the buoys. Competitors may lose contact on the way out without penalty

provided they regain the craft and round the last turning buoy of each leg in contact with the craft and complete the course.



SURF BOARD/SURF SKI RELAY

General Conditions

The Rules of the surf board and surf ski Events shall apply to surf board and surf ski relay Events unless varied as follows.

- (a) Teams shall consist of two Competitors.
- (b) Team members cannot use the same craft. No member of a team shall be permitted to complete more than one leg of a Race.
- (c) The first and second Competitor in each team shall commence from the team's drawn starting position.
- (d) Control of craft – A Competitor can lose control or contact with their craft on the way out, provided they regain the craft and round the last course buoy in contact with the craft. A Competitor must paddle their ski (including paddle) or board (as applicable) around the last course buoy and shall not be disqualified if they lose control or contact with their craft after the last course buoy on the return journey

The Course

The course for surf board relay Events shall be as detailed in Figure 5.4 and the course for surf ski relay Events shall be as detailed in Figure 5.5 of the Surf Sports Competition Manual.

Procedure

- (a) Competitors for the first leg of the relay shall start as per the relevant individual Event and proceed around the appropriate buoys. When the first Competitor has rounded the last turning buoy, the Competitor may leave their ski (including paddle) or board (as applicable) at their discretion, round the two green and yellow turning flags and tag the second Competitor at the designated ski or board (as appropriate) changeover line.
- (b) The second Competitor will then proceed around the appropriate buoys. When the second Competitor has rounded the last turning buoy, the Competitor may leave their ski (including paddle) or board (as applicable) at their discretion, round the green and yellow turning flag and pass the other green and yellow flag on the shoreward side to finish between the two green finish flags.
- (c) The second leg Competitors in the surf board relay Event shall be positioned with their toes on or behind the changeover line or on the shoreward side of the changeover line. In the ski relay event the start changeover line will be located in the water.
- (d) Competitors in the surf board and surf ski relay Events must commence their leg of the Event from the (correct) position as allotted by the Marshall. If the Competitor does not comply with the officials' direction, their team may be disqualified.
- (e) Members of the team or other members authorised by the Event Referee shall ensure that any craft used by any of the other team members does not cause any interference to another team or Competitor in the Race. The craft shall be removed as soon as possible from the course to avoid congestion and possible damage.
- (f) If a competitor deliberately impedes the progress of another team the competitors in the offending team may be disqualified.
- (g) To assist with the safe conduct of the Event it is permitted for any team member to assist with the removal of any damaged.

SURF CANOE RELAY

Procedure

Surf Canoe Event rules will apply as set out in this Section 4 of the Surf Sport Competition Manual, except where varied as follows:

- (a) Relay teams shall consist of two open crews. These crews shall be one open male and one open female crew.
- (b) Rowers are permitted to paddle only in one leg of the relay Race.
- (c) Crews are permitted to row in any order.
- (d) The General Rules of Racing as described in Section 4.1 (Surf canoe & Surf Canoe Events – General Conditions) shall apply except where varied by these rules.

Equipment

- (a) Relay teams may use two surf canoes.
- (b) Replacement of a surf canoe, paddles and gear may also occur in each leg in accordance with the standard rules for surf canoe Events.

Course

- (a) In surf canoe relay Events there is an increased potential for canoes on the course interfering with others in a Race because of the two legs that comprise each Race.
- (b) Each racing position shall have two beach flags (corresponding to the colour of the teams turning buoy) positioned 15 metres from the water's edge and approximately 5 metres apart. The beach flags shall be the start/finish line for each leg of the Race and finish point for the Race for each team. The flags for all teams should normally be placed in a straight line across the whole of the area.
- (c) The standard canoe in-water finishing flags shall be placed in the water at either side of the course as per conventional Races. All surf canoes must start and cross within these flags for the finish of each leg of the Relay Race.

Start

- (a) The first crew shall float their canoe in the water as with a wet start for an individual Race approximately adjacent to the team's allocated beach flags.
- (b) One member of the crew is positioned between their respective beach flags with their toes on or behind a line between the two beach flags and awaits the starter's signal before running to the canoe.
- (c) The balance of the crew remains with the canoe and cannot enter the canoe until the runner touches any part of the surf canoe following the starter's gun (not the paddles).
- (d) On the starter's gun, the crew member runs to the canoe.
- (e) The crew then paddles the course as per the standard rules for surf canoe Races and as described in this section.

Change Over's Between Relay Legs

- (a) After the first part of the canoe has passed through the in-water finish flags one or more runners release contact with the canoe and run to and through the team's allocated beach flags. The first runner then tags a member of the second crew who is waiting with their toes on or behind the start change over line.
- (b) Only crew members in contact with the canoe as it crosses the in-water finish flags may run to and through the teams allocated beach flags to tag the second crew's Competitor.
- (c) The second runner's feet cannot cross the line to commence the second crew's leg of the Race until after the tag has been affected but the tag may be affected on the seaward or shoreward side of the line.
- (d) The runner from the second crew then runs to the balance of the crew who are waiting with their canoe on the sand or in the water behind the in-water finish flags. The crew competing in the next leg cannot enter the canoe until the runner touches any part of the canoe (not the paddles).

Canoe Management

- (a) Unless specifically approved by the Event Referee only the crews involved in the canoe relay Event may handle the equipment inside the Competition Arena after the commencement of a Race and until all teams in the Race have completed the Race or withdrawn.
- (b) When handling canoes within the Competition Area during the Event team members shall:
 - (i) Comply with all instructions of officials.
 - (ii) Make every effort to ensure that they and/or the canoe they are handling do not impede another team, otherwise their team may be disqualified and the team the subject of disciplinary action.
 - (iii) Hold the canoe as directed by the relevant official.
This will assist with the safe moving and controlling of canoes and the fair conduct of competition.
- (b) Handlers not in the Race may assist move canoes and gear to the in-water finish line prior to the commencement of a Race and assist by bringing any other replacement canoes and/or gear to the start/finish line only. These handlers must also comply with all instructions of officials.

Finish

- (a) A minimum of two paddlers must be in control surf canoe until any part of it passes through the in-water finishing flags positioned on either side of the course. (Under Control means – a canoe must have at least 2 members wearing caps in contact with it and they shall have at least 2 paddles.)
- (b) After the first part of the canoe has passed through the in-water finish flags one or more runners release contact with the canoe and runs to the teams allocated beach flags and across the team's allocated start/finish line.
- (c) An alternate finish may be prescribed by the Event Referee.

SURF CANOE Races

All canoe races will have a "Dry Finish" as detailed in the Surf Sport Competition Manual, 4.2.7 (b), page 101.
