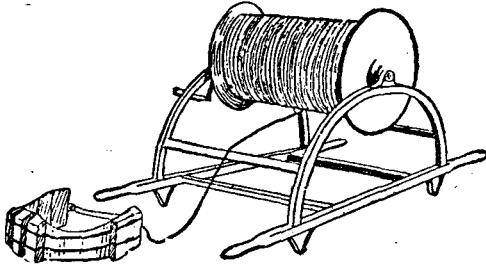

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# Tenth Annual Report and Financial Statement

To be presented at the Annual General Meeting to be held at 7.30 p.m., SATURDAY, OCTOBER 24th, 1942.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

In submitting for your review the Tenth Annual Report and Financial Statement of the Association your Council places on record its appreciation of the efforts of District Associations and Clubs during the past season, and though operations were carried out, in most cases, under difficult circumstances, the result of the year's activities is one of which all concerned may well be proud.

Necessity demands that every effort shall, and will, be made to condense this report without in any way affecting the recording of the various activities of the Association during the year.

Once again we regret the necessity of recording a full year of activities under war conditions. During the past year all Clubs added their quota of membership to the large force of surf life-savers who are taking and playing a prominent part in the defence of their Homeland and the cause of Democracy and Freedom.

Again it is pleasing to report the steady influx of Junior members and the formation of ladies' teams in various parts of the Dominion, thus helping to carry on the work during the temporary absence of our members on active service, overseas and at home.

It was deemed advisable not to hold any National Championships during the past year, and after due consideration of the many aspects of the position, in February it was decided to cancel the holding of the Junior and Ladies' Surf Life Saving Championships also.

The national appeal made to the local bodies of the Dominion, as a result of a conference with the Hon. Minister of Internal Affairs (Hon. W. E. Parry, M.P.) has been finalised as far as the local bodies are concerned, and the result of the appeal must be recorded as very disappointing indeed. Admittedly the appeal was launched during a difficult period, but it is evident that many local bodies failed to realise the national as well as local importance of the appeal, and the desirability of having all beaches, rivers, lakes, etc., adequately protected either by qualified life-savers or by the installation of efficient life-saving equipment.

Your Council desires to place on record its appreciation of the continuance of a spirit of goodwill and co-operation so long existing between the Council, District Associations and individual Clubs, and feels confident that, despite the possibility of even greater difficulties to face during the coming season, every effort will be made to maintain the ever-increasing efficiency and national importance of our organisation.

### HIS MAJESTY KING GEORGE VI.

It is with pleasure we record the receipt from Central Executive, R.L.S.S., London, of an indication of the continued interest of His Majesty in the operations of our organisation and re-affirm our loyalty to the Crown.

### ON ACTIVE SERVICE, AT HOME AND OVERSEAS.

The Ninth Annual Report recorded, in summarised form, the names of our members who up to that period had been drafted to the varied phases of active service, and every effort will be made in this report to present the additional names of our members drafted during the past year. Due to local conditions, in many cases, difficulties may arise in compiling a complete list. In some Clubs almost the whole membership is on active service of some nature, whilst in other cases difficulty may be found in securing the services of a secretary.

Whether successful or not in compiling a complete list, it is evident, by the lists compiled last year and this, that the Association has every cause for congratulating itself and its membership on the great and ready response made to the national call for service.

Our members are operating in all phases of national service and in many parts of the world, many holding important positions, all of them giving of their best wherever they may be.

We record, with deep regret, additions to our National Roll of Honour. Many of our members have passed beyond the Vale. In memory we honour them and pay tribute to their sacrifice. To their relatives we tender our very sincere sympathy in their great loss.

The wounds of battles are ever increasing, and we note with sorrow the inclusion of many of our members. May a speedy recovery come to them. Among the Missing and Prisoners of War we find records of our members, and hope that ere long brighter and better news will be heard of them.

## PATROL DUTIES.

During the past year many Clubs found difficulty in maintaining their quota of beach patrols. Many beaches have been taken over by other authorities, and in some areas climatic conditions were far from favourable. Despite these unavoidable incidents every effort has been made to ensure the presence of qualified surf life-savers on our beaches. Appreciation is expressed to the many junior and ladies' teams that have undertaken this important part of our activities.

### HOURS OF PATROL—41,395.

The hours of patrol operations quoted, though fewer than in previous reports, when compared with the number of available beaches to patrol, is indicative of the continued desire of surf life-savers to ensure that the fullest protection possible is given to bathers.

### SURF LIFE-SAVING MEDALLIONS.

The standard of efficiency required to attain the Surf Life-Saving Medallion has been maintained during the past year, and the following table of issues is very pleasing, and congratulations are extended to all District Associations and individual Clubs on this phase of the year's working.

## AFFLICATIONS.

YOUR COUNCIL DESIRES, AT THIS STAGE IN ITS REPORT, TO APPEAL TO THE PUBLIC WHO FREQUENT OUR BEACHES TO ASSIST THE SURF LIFE-SAVING CLUBS BY SWIMMING IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO SURF CLUB-HOUSES, IN VIEW OF THE EVER DECREASING OPPORTUNITY OF EXTENDING THE BEACH PATROL AREAS BEYOND THOSE AT PRESENT PATROLLED. EVERY EFFORT WILL BE MADE TO SAFEGUARD THE LIVES OF BATHERS, BUT IT MUST NOT, AND CANNOT, BE A ONE-SIDED OBLIGATION. FULL CO-OPERATION IS DESIRABLE IF LIVES ARE TO BE PROTECTED.

## ANNUAL RETURNS.

Thirty-six Clubs have furnished their annual return forms, and in view of present conditions their response is very satisfactory.

## AFFILIATIONS.

Auckland, Canterbury, Otago, Taranaki, and Wellington District Associations are affiliated to the National Body. Total, 5.

No further progress has been made in endeavouring to secure the affiliation of the Tangimoana and Hokitika Clubs.

## ROYAL LIFE-SAVING SOCIETY—LONDON TROPHY COMPETITION.

Due to war-time conditions, minor amendments were made to the rules governing this competition. The Adjudicator (Mr. V. L. Allan) states that despite many difficulties encountered during the year five district Associations entered, and the final result was very close. The occupation of many of the Surf Club buildings has meant a lowering number of surf awards issued during the past year. Tribute is paid to the work of the Ladies and Junior members of the Clubs and the part they are playing in ensuring the continuance of the operations of the Association. Thanks are expressed for the assistance given by district and club secretari in the compiling of the returns.

## **JUNIOR MEMBERS.**

It is evident that the continued progress of any organisation is the steady influx into membership of junior members, and during the past year the Association has done well in this respect. There is much yet to be done, and it is possible that with a further continuance of war conditions the position may even become worse. Every effort should be made by Clubs and Associations to approach all secondary schools in an endeavour to maintain a steady stream of junior members for the organisation. In some districts much has been done in this direction already, with results most satisfactory.

## **N.Z. GOVERNMENT AND THE ASSOCIATION.**

As in previous years, this report would not be complete without placing on record the Council's appreciation of the continued practical interest of the Government in the operations of the Association.

To the Hon. W. E. Parry, M.P. (Hon. Minister of Internal Affairs) and the Officers of his Department thanks and appreciation are expressed for their continued support and appreciation of the activities of the Association. Without the financial assistance received annually from the Government it would have been impossible for the Association to have made the steady progress recorded from year to year.

## **FINANCES.**

In view of the Hon. Treasurer (Mr. F. H. Jackson) going on active service the finances of the Association are for a eleven-month period this year. The financial statement herein shown indicates the expanding activities of the Association. The purchase by the Council of fifty (50) surf life-saving lines during the year, though taxing the financial resources of the Association to breaking point, was justified, and the Council is appreciative of the services that made it possible for its order to be landed safely in the Dominion under the existing conditions. To Mr. F. H. Jackson thanks and appreciation are expressed for his excellent services during the year, and the hope is expressed that it will not be very long before he again resumes the office of Treasurer, which he has filled for so many years with great distinction.

## **OUTSTANDING RESCUES AT NORTH BEACH, CANTERBURY.**

On January 29th three junior members of the North Beach Club performed outstanding rescues, which have been recognised by the presentation of Silver Meritorious Awards to Ian Davison and Bernard H. Brown, and a Letter of Commendation to Robert Moore. Congratulations are extended to these three junior members on the excellent work performed by them and to the North Beach Club on the excellent performance of their junior members.

## **E.P.S. AND HOME GUARD ACTIVITIES.**

Many of our members are still actively engaged in the above services, whilst the spare time of many of our members is devoted to instruction in artificial respiration to E.P.S. and Home Guard members, as well as Fire Brigades and E.P.S. personnel. As this

operation comes under the operations of the R.L.S.S., no doubt further reference will be made in that Society's report. Suffice to say that the members of the Surf Life-Saving Clubs are ever anxious to assist our sister organisation in the furtherance of its work.

#### **NATIONAL BOARD OF JUDGES AND SUB-COMMITTEES.**

As no Surf Life-Saving Championships were held during the year, the work of this Board was lightened considerably. Thanks are here expressed to the members of the Board and to the sub-committees for their assistance during the year.

#### **N.Z.A.S.A. AND DOMINION COUNCIL R.L.S.S.**

Again your Council records its pleasure at the continuance of a spirit of goodwill and full co-operation between the two above national organisations and our Association. The future of nautical activities throughout the Dominion is assured whilst such a spirit continues.

#### **NATIONAL COMMITTEE OF SWIMMING AND LIFE-SAVING.**

Due to many causes the work of this Committee has been very light. Your delegates (Messrs. V. L. Allan and F. H. Jackson) attended the meetings held, and are thanked for their services.
