



Papamoa Junior Surf Carnival 2022

Date: Sunday 23rd January 2022

Venue: Papamoa SLSC, Papamoa Beach

Registrations: Entry opens 12pm 13th Dec 2021 on the SLSNZ EnterNow system <http://slnz.enternow.co.nz>

Entries will close 10am 15th January 2022. *This will be a fully vaccinated event.*

Entry cost: \$20.00 per competitor.

Event Overview:

Following on from the success of last year, the Papamoa Junior Carnival has a mixed focus of traditional events for the younger age groups so they can extend on their skills and then a slightly different format for the older age groups with a focus on team and rescue events in preparation for Eastern Regional Champs and Oceans 2022.

This year's event will be a fully vaccinated event. All children over the age of 12, all officials, lifeguards and team managers must be fully vaccinated. The carnival will be run in two (2) sessions to accommodate change in levels, EG: if we go into the red traffic light, we will already be in the right set up to accommodate this.

Session one will be under 8's, under 9's and 10's starting at 8.30am. The second session is under 11s, 12's, 13's and 14's starting at 1pm.

High Visibility Vests: High visibility vests are compulsory for all water event competitors including warm-up and warm-down

Racing Uniform: Club caps are compulsory

NOTE: Due to the CPF we will be running this event if we are in **RED** then we can still have an event. If we are in orange, then that will be a bonus.

Age Groups by Arena: (U8 & U9) (U10) (U11&12) (U13&14)

Please note that the age groups listed are dependent upon the number of entries and surf/weather conditions. Age group is determined by the competitor's age as on 30th September 2021. For example, if you are 11 on the 30th September 2021, you will race in the U12 age group.

Missing Persons at Sea Protocol:

Any lifeguards/parents who are competent swimmers please bring fins, goggles, wetsuit jacket or wetsuit so they can assist if there is a missing person at sea. Please ensure all Team Managers, coaches and parents are familiar with the missing persons at sea system.

200M BADGE

All junior members who wish to use foam or fibreglass paddleboards and/or swim beyond waist depth must hold their 200m safety badge. This is a mandatory safety requirement which demonstrates that junior members are confident in the ocean and capable of returning to shore if they are separated from their equipment. The badge must be displayed on each individual competitor's beanie or togs.

Events

- The events listed are dependent upon the number of entries and surf/weather conditions.
- The rules for each of these events can be found in the Surf Sports Competition Manual.
- **Flag teams:** Essentially flags, but with a surf teams style points system. Teams of four will work together to finish with the most accumulative points. Points will be awarded to every individual participant as they are eliminated. Team totals will be added up at the end.
 - Before the event starts, every participant will be randomly spread out over the Snake.
 - A round of flag teams will consist of a full rotation of the head of the Snake. A new "Round" will begin every time, the head of the Snake, enters /re-enters the arena regardless of if the tail of the previous round has run.
 - With every "Round" a participant survives, the points they are awarded upon elimination increases by 1. For example, in a snake of 10 teams of 4 (40 people), everyone eliminated before the head of the Snake re-enters the arena will receive 1 point. In the Follow round, everyone eliminated will receive 2 and so on.
 - Two participants will be eliminated every run until there are less than 9 participants. After this point, the order will be randomized every round, and only 1 participant will be eliminated each round.

Club Requirements to Provide Officials/Helpers: (MVP required)

All clubs must provide at least one official with good knowledge of the events in order to assist our officials based on the ratio of one official per 10 athletes. Clubs with under 10 participants are not required to provide assistance unless they have the capacity to do so. Unfortunate teams/athletes are not permitted to participate unless they have the required parent/adult support ratios. Additional parent helper, qualified lifeguard for water safety assistance would also be of assistance to run this carnival effectively.

Club Points and Presentations

Ribbons will be given for first, second and third place in each event and will be presented in each arena at the end of the conclusion of the days racing.

Club Points will be allocated for all team finals as follows: 1st place= 5 points, 2nd place 3 points, 3rd place 1 point. Composite teams will be allowed to enter to give competitors the opportunity to compete in additional events but no points will be awarded to any composite teams.

We reserve the right to change and modify any events due to adverse weather/conditions on the day.

Club Points and Presentations

Ribbons will be given for first, second and third place in each event and will be presented in each arena at the end of the conclusion of the days racing.

Club Points will be allocated for all individual finals as follows: 1st place= 3 points, 2nd place 2 points, 3rd place 1 point. Composite teams will be allowed to enter to give competitors the opportunity to compete in additional events but no points will be awarded to any composite teams.
