Instructions

Create or have participants create small groups to work in.
Allocate each group a scenario to analyse.
Groups brainstorm and answer the general questions about the scenarios.
Groups share their scenario and responses back with the whole group.
Additional ideas can be shared by wider group.

1. You arrive at the beach and the lifeguards are flying the red flag from the clubhouse and you can't see any patrol flags.
2. You are down at the beach for a game of touch with your friends. Someone suggests you should go in for a 'quick dip' to cool off. You notice a danger rips sign.
3. You are swimming close to shore when you feel the water moving out to sea. You think you might be caught in a rip.
4. You have been out surfing for a long time and notice you are feeling cold. It is a grey, windy day and not very warm.
5. If you turn up to the beach and you see the red flag on the lifeguard tower, what does this mean?
