The purpose of updating the manual is to ensure it continues to provide a safe and fair framework that assists the membership to participate in Lifesaving Sport.

Members are invited to suggest the addition, removal or change of any rules with a focus on the principles of safety, equity, fairness, enjoyment and using easy to understand language.

It is also the intention to continue to separate the different sections of the competition manual into stand-alone manuals that align with our competition structure e.g. Pool Rescue, Large Craft (IRB, Boat & Canoe) and Ocean/Beach.

July 1 – August 30	Final recommendations and approvals	The final recommendations would be agreed upon and approved via the NSC.
September 1 – September 30	Updating of the manual	Existing manual updated with any changes, preparation of communications.
October 1 – October 31	Member notification, online updating & printing	All changes communicated via various channels – website, social media, operations circulars
November 1	Physical manual available	Distributed via sport managers
