The Rock Training & Rescue Module Pathway involves competency-based training and assessment. This means that each candidate needs to be deemed competent in the course components for each qualification.

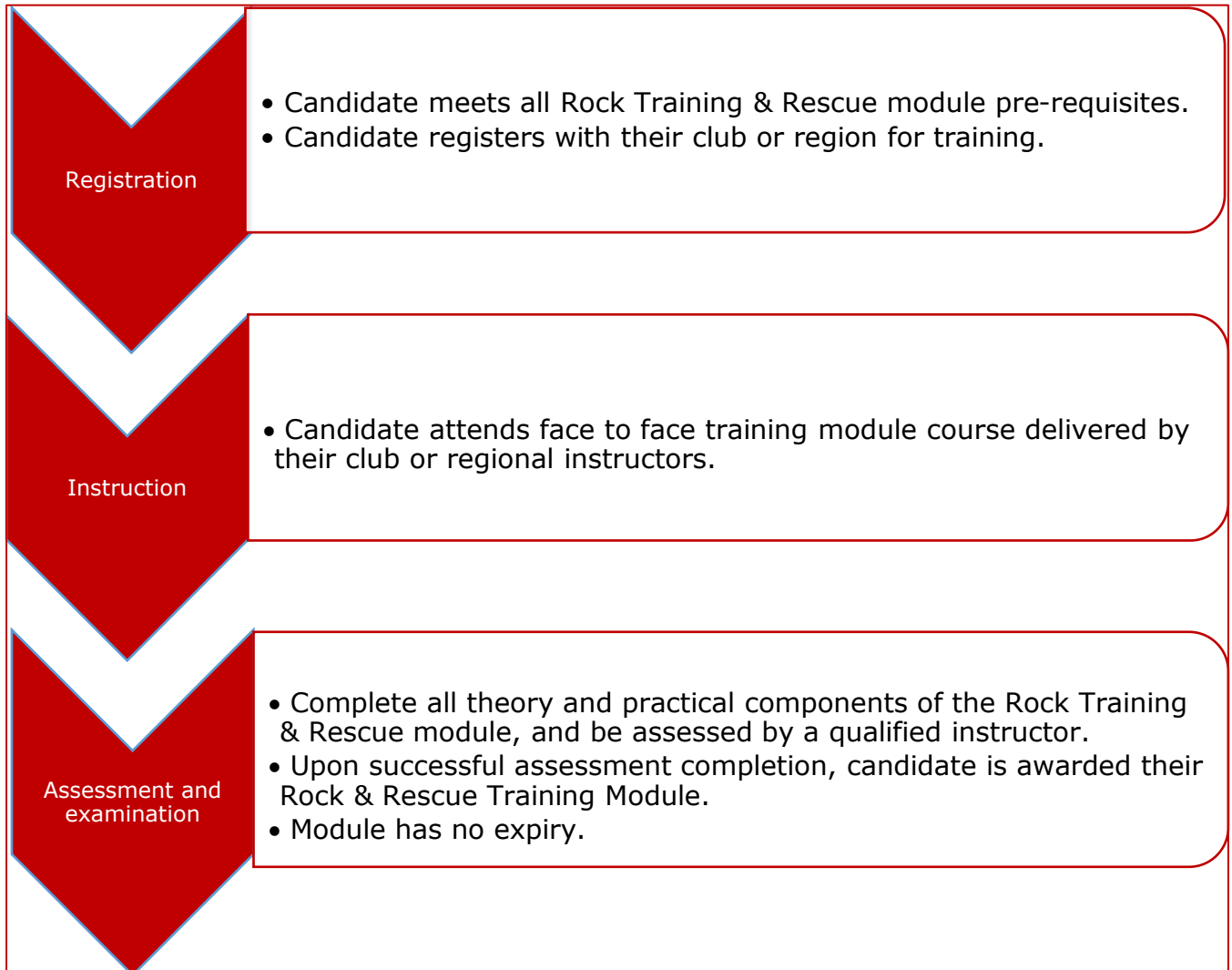

<p>The Rock Training & Rescue Module (RTM) is the starting point for training lifeguards in rock activities and operations. The RTM gives Surf Lifeguards the knowledge and skill required to perform rock entries, exits and rescues.</p>	<p>This pathway enables members to obtain relevant theory and practical skills for instruction and teaching to be utilised when instructing members in rock activities.</p>	<p>This pathway enables members to obtain relevant knowledge and skills to deliver the Rock Training & Rescue Instructors Training course and assess all trainee instructors.</p>

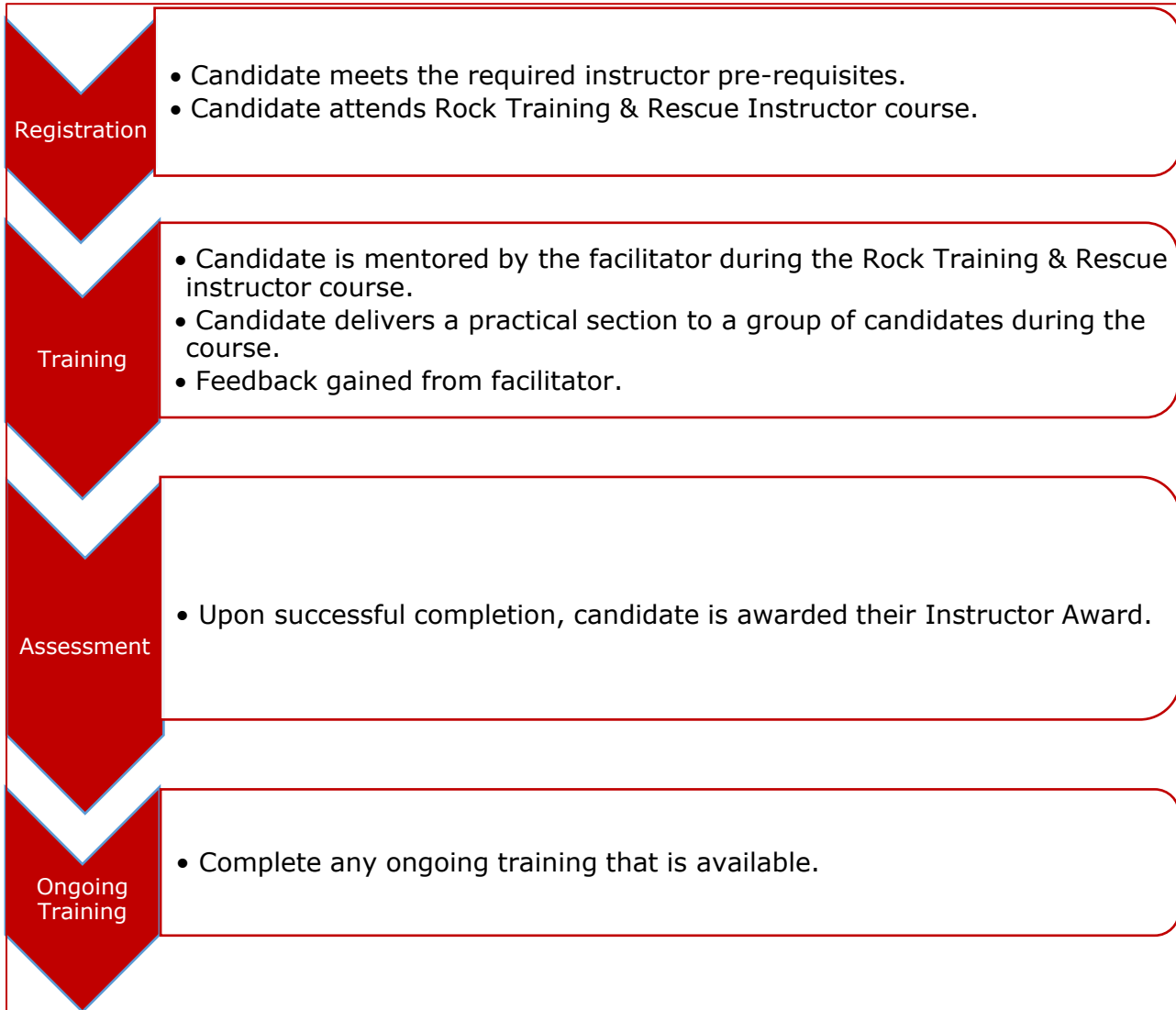


Rock Training & Rescue Module - Candidate Training Process
